Council has invested significant funds and considerable staff resources in fighting this case alongside the community.

It is the single biggest legal investment by this council.

This shows our organisation's level of commitment to this matter and we remain united with the community in finding a solution.

Councillors share the community's concerns, are equally frustrated and would dearly love to be able to do more.

Council has been transparent and honest with all community stakeholders about the complex nature of this matter and what we as an organisation can and can't do during the judicial process.



Council established a Kin Kin Roundtable and continues to liaise with these members in regard to this matter.

Way forward



As we anxiously wait for a decision in the Planning and Environment Court, we have been in consistent contact with legal counsel in relation to the community's concerns.

Given the matter is still under consideration by his Honour Judge Long SC, it is important to respect the judicial process and it is in the best interests of all parties to allow the process to run its course.

Council understands and mirrors the concerns of the community.

While we wait for the outcome, Council continues to seek legal advice in relation to the matter.
