

Sunshine Beach Skate Shade Sail installation

Project Update

Council will shortly commence installation of a shade sail at Sunshine Beach Skate Park. The shade sail will enhance user and spectator amenities, providing relief and protection from the sun and has been made possible through State Government Unite and Recover Funding.

Community Consultation

The final shade sail designs are based on feedback from local skate park users and take into consideration how the park is currently used as well as engineering and safety requirements of the structure.

By enhancing the park amenity with additional shade, Council is meeting community needs and future trends of skate culture by creating a social destination for the broader youth community.

Construction works

Construction is due to start in mid-August and be completed within 5 weeks, weather permitting.

The park will **BE CLOSED** during the construction period. A number of car parking spaces immediately adjacent to the park entrance will also be fenced off during construction.

Future Skate Park works

Council plans to replace the metal skate ramp/half pipe at the park in early 2022. The ramp, originally installed in 1988, will be replaced with a prefabricated structure with materials better suited to the coastal environment.

The shade sail and new skate ramp/half pipe will ensure the Sunshine Beach Skate Park remains a popular facility with local families and continues to be used as a training ground for up and coming international and local skaters from as far as Hervey Bay and Brisbane.
