- New grant category in addition to other grants
- Reducing Emissions to achieve net zero emissions by 2026
- Assisting the community become more resilient to the impacts of climate change over time
- Address one or more of the themes in the recently endorsed Climate Change Response Plan

 - ii. Energy efficiency and governance
 - iii. Clean low emissions industries

 - v. Health & resilient natural systems and carbon sequestration and food systems
 - vi. Sustainable agriculture
 - vii. Resilient and adaptive communities and built environments
 - viii. Zero waste and circular economies

Project Grant - minimum \$1,000, maximum \$30,000

RADF Grant - minimum \$1,000, maximum \$5,000

- 3rd party beneficiary

- acknowledge Council's contribution
- final report (acquit) on time
- provide photographs
