Sobraon Street Sunrise Beach – impact of weather event

Summary

Following the intense rainfall event over the weekend of 26-27 February, damage to the constructed stormwater outfall protection occurred.

This has impacted a small section of the sandy slope near the Sobraon and Vernon Street, Sunrise Beach intersection.

Council has attended the site with its geotechnical engineering support and are working with the contractor to implement temporary treatments to limit any further damage to the slope, until a permanent solution can be constructed.

Temporary Works

Temporary protection work will involve the blocking of three upstream stormwater inlets and the installation of a surface protection to the outfall to manage damaging stormwater flow. As a result, road users may experience additional flow along the roadway of Sobraon St during periods of heavy rainfall.

Future Works

Council is investigating alternative design options and is continuing to work with the project team to implement a permanent solution as soon as possible.

Impact

The works are expected to have minimal impact to the community. Council is continuing to monitor the site conditions and will advise if other impacts are expected.
