

Project news 3rd December 2021

Ross Crescent Slope Stabilisation, Sunshine Beach

Project summary

Recent geotechnical investigations have detected evidence of slope instability within the dune area adjacent to Ross Crescent. This is due to the recent rain events, loose sandy material, and the steep topography of the site.

Council has been closely monitoring the slope for movement and now need to complete repair works in the area to stop any future movement.

Project overview

As the area is not easily accessible, short term remediation works will help provide a solution to stabilise the slope and provide time to develop and investigate a long-term geotechnical solution. Future works will be completed in the new year to provide a permanent solution.

Short term remediation work will include:

- slope stabilisation
- sand bagging
- installation of geofabric material

These works are vital to maintaining the long-term serviceability of the footpath area and help prevent further slippage.

Project timing

Work is commencing Friday 3rd December 2021, and is expected to take up to 2 weeks, weather dependant. Due to the emergent nature of the project, work will continue over the weekend.

Footpath and community impacts

The footpath area between Sobraon Street and Ross Crescent will be closed during working hours. Detours with signage directing pedestrians will be in place. This will also include the informal beach accesses. Ross Crescent will remain open to traffic however several large trucks will be in the area to be used to deliver material to the work site
