Pathway improvements – Stage 2

Project summary

Council contractors will shortly start work on the second stage of pathway improvements identified in the Noosa Cycling and Walking Strategy and Implementation Plan (the Plan).

The Plan is designed to get more people riding a bike and walking for health, transport, tourism and the environment. The NCWSAP identifies and prioritises improvements to our existing bike riding and walking paths to create a connected and safe network.

A package of 11 pathway improvements is being delivered in three stages with the first stage, consisting of three pathways - Castaways Beach (Flagship Court), Peregian Beach (Plover Street) and Noosaville (Swan Street) completed.

This project is proudly funded by the Queensland Government's South East Queensland Community Stimulus Package in association with Noosa Council.

Stage 2 Pathways

Three pathways will be improved to deliver Stage 2 of this work:

- Noosaville Bluebell Court new 'missing pathway' link
- Tewantin Ernest/Goodchap Street new 'missing pathway' link
- Tewantin Tinaroo Place new 'missing pathway' link

Stages 3 Pathways

The final stage of pathway improvements or construction of new 'missing links' will include:

- Pomona Stan Topper Park
- Cooroy Tewantin Road
- Cooroy Maple Street/Overlander Avenue
- Sunshine Beach Belmore Terrace

In addition, Council will also be constructing a 40m pathway connection from the bus stop on Furness Drive to the Monterey Retirement community driveway at 58 Furness Drive, Tewantin as part of work to improve the bus stop accessibility and achieve Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) compliance.

This package of 11 pathways, valued at \$538,000, will be delivered by local contractors creating jobs and helping stimulate the local economy.
