Trail 5 Upgrade Works and Temporary Closures

Project Summary

Noosa Council is upgrading the Cooroora Trail, also known as Trail 5, which links Pomona to Cooran via the Tuchekoi National Park, Trail works, including upgrading the trailhead facilities in both Pomona and Cooran, will improve the trail experience and town connectivity.

Scope of Works

The following work is scheduled to commence mid-November:

Trail 5

- realignment and widening of the trail
- drainage upgrades
- new wayfinding and interpretative signage.

Cooroora Mountain Park, Pomona

- sealing of existing gravel car parks
- pavement rehabilitation and drainage works
- new filtered water station
- new shelter, table and chairs.

Pioneer Park, Cooran

- installation of new concrete car parks
- installation of bollards
- new hitching rails.

New wayfinding and interpretive signage will be installed at Pioneer Park, Cooran, Stan Topper Park and Cooroora Mountain Park, Pomona.

Timing

Construction is scheduled to commence on 14 November 2022 and will be completed early next year, weather permitting.

Temporary Closures

Trail 5

Sections of Trail 5 will be closed intermittently from 14 November during construction. Alternative access will be provided where possible. However, it is recommended that trail goers explore other Noosa Biosphere Trails during this time. To discover a new trail visit: https://www.noosa.gld.gov.au/noosa-trailnetwork

Cooroora Mountain Park, Pomona

The Mt Cooroora car park will be temporarily closed from the 14 November to late 2022.

Visitors can access the Lookout Trail from Stan Topper Park via Mountain Street. Please be considerate of neighbouring properties when accessing the area.

Pioneer Park, Cooran

Sections of the park will be temporarily closed during construction.

Traffic control will be in place where required.

Please take care navigating the area.




Image: Trail 5 car park and trail head closure
