Cooroy, Cooroy-Belli Creek Road

Project update

The 2022 flooding event caused damage at several locations on Cooroy-Belli Creek Road.

Sunshine Civil Solutions Pty Ltd (SCS) has been awarded the contract to undertake works at 179 Cooroy-Belli Creek Road.

Reconstruction will include:

- earthworks
- concrete bored piles
- rock embankment stabilisation
- subsoil drains and surface drainage works
- pavement replacement.

These works will help provide long-term stabilisation of the road.

The flood recovery effort for Noosa Council is jointly funded by the Commonwealth-State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

We acknowledge the significant disruption along Cooroy-Belli Creek Road arising from recent bridge renewal and these flood recovery repairs.

Thank you for your ongoing patience while Council maintains and repairs critical hinterland assets.

Construction timing

Site establishment and construction will start in April 2024. Construction will take about three months, weather and construction conditions permitting.

Traffic and community impacts

Lane closure

Due to the confined working area, one lane of this section of Cooroy-Belli Creek Road must be closed to ensure the safety of motorists and workers.

Two lanes of traffic will be reduced to one lane during this time under the control of temporary traffic signals.

Please refer to the map showing the location of the works. Other reconstruction projects also underway across the hinterland include:

- Old Ceylon Road
- Happy Jack Road
- Black Pinch Road
- Cootharaba Road
- Musa Vale Road.

Motorists are reminded to drive to the changed conditions and follow signage.

Work hours

Construction will generally be completed between Monday and Friday, 6.30am-5pm. Advance notice will be provided to adjacent residents about any work outside these hours.

Audible noise and vibration

Audible noise and vibration from construction activities, such as piling, can be expected.

Reversing beepers and flashing lights are a safety requirement on heavy machinery and will be used during work hours.
