


Putting Residents First

Your 2023-24 Budget

- Average rates increase of 5.5% for most properties across the shire (Almost 2% below CPI).
- Freeze on levies.
- Efficiencies to deliver agreed service levels while dealing with increasing external cost pressures that our community also faces.
- Mitigate impact of State Government imposed record increases in land valuations.



By adjusting how the valuation flows through to rates, we have significantly reduced the impact on the rate rise as best we can in recognition of cost-of-living pressures.

Adjacent graph shows valuation increase vs actual rates impact.

Rates charges at a glance:

0%	Freeze on levies (Environment, Heritage and Sustainable Transport)
\$1.72 per week	Average increase to total rates notice
75%	Ratepayers with a rate rise lower than CPI
\$115	Full pension rebate for every eligible pensioner

War on Waste

We are continuing to find ways to better manage our waste.

- Finalise the Waste Strategy.
- \$3.6 million to finish expansion of landfill cell.
- Investigate ways to turn our waste into a resource and revenue source.
- A feasibility study into resource recovery options, such as the polystyrene processing machine.
- A campaign to target illegal dumping and programs to improve waste separation and diversion at the landfill.

- Ongoing funding of Living Well Noosa program.
- Continue *Go Noosa* free weekend buses.
- Monitoring of flora and fauna threatened species.
- Increase in parks/gardens resourcing.
- Master Planning for Noosa Botanic Gardens.
- Progress Destination Management Plan.
