



Pool Safety Certificate

Buying, Selling or Leasing a property with a Swimming Pool?

You may need a safety certificate for a swimming pool if you are buying, selling, or leasing a property. You may also want a certificate for peace of mind.

Step 1: Find a Pool Safety Inspector

Visit the QBCC website to find a suitably qualified **pool safety inspector** - <https://my.qbcc.qld.gov.au/myQBCC/s/pool-safety-inspector-search>
OR Council's pool safety inspector can undertake the inspection.

Step 2: Contact & book the inspector

Contact your preferred pool safety inspector to undertake the inspection. The inspector will advise their fees, once paid they will arrange a time to inspect.
Please note there is no set fees for inspections.

Step 3: Inspection completed & barrier compliant

When the pool barrier is compliant – the inspector will issue the pool safety certificate and upload the details to the QBCC swimming pool register.

Step 4: Inspection completed & barrier non-compliant

The pool safety inspector may issue a non-conformity notice (Form 26) along with a report identifying items that failed the inspection & advice on repair options. A follow up inspection may be required on completion of repairs. *Additional fees may apply.*
