Peregrin Square Maintenance & Minor Refurbishment, Peregrin Beach

This update builds on the Project News issued in September, reiterating key information for context and providing the latest progress updates.

Project Summary

Maintenance and minor upgrades are progressing well at the Peregrin Square Precinct to enhance safety, accessibility, and appearance. Works include refreshing garden beds and lawns, timber renewal, additional seating areas, and improving stormwater management — helping preserve green spaces, strengthen connections between the park and dining precinct, and ensure the area remains an inviting community hub for years to come.

Timing

Construction began in late August 2025, with most works now nearing completion. A few remaining elements are expected to be finalised by the end of the year. The project team will progressively reopen sections of the park as they are completed and safe for public access.

The southern section of the square will reopen in the next few days, with the full precinct expected to be ready for the community to enjoy before Christmas.

Scope of Works

Key deliverables of the project include:

- Refurbishment of garden beds and lawn
- New turf and irrigation
- Extension of the rock wall at the southern end to improve erosion control
- Timber seating around the Tuckeroo tree
- Replacement of rotten timbers and repairs to existing structures
- New garden beds on the southern side
- Crazy paving for the entrance walkway and new seating under the hibiscus
- Crushed sandstone and deco granite entrance way (northern section)

Work Hours

Construction takes place Monday to Friday, between 6:30 am and 5:00 pm.

To minimise disruption to local businesses, heavy machinery and earthworks cease around 11:00 am ahead of the busy lunchtime dining period.

Progress to Date

Recent works have included:

- Reinstallation of irrigation lines
- Installation of new turf at the southern end
- Construction of the southern rock wall
- Pressure washing of the stage
- Planting of the southern garden beds
- Forming and pouring concrete edges
- Completion of crazy paving and grouting
- Stage timber decking works by the bridge crew

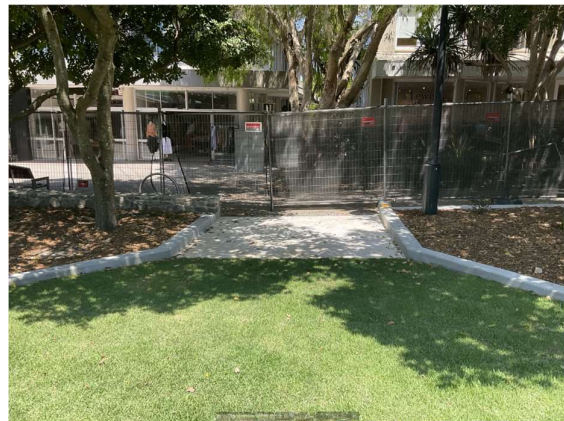

Upcoming Works

The team is now focusing on:

- Stripping formwork and preparing remaining concrete edges
- Completing minor touch-ups, mowing, cleaning, and stone sealing on the southern side — with plans to reopen the newly turfed area soon
- Installing soil, mulch, and plants in the garden bed adjacent to the crazy paved area
- Laying crushed sandstone around the stage, timber platform, and paved areas
- Preparing the northern area for turf installation

Before the end of the year, remaining works will include:

- Installation of new seats in the paved seating area (arriving early December)
- Repainting of the stage
- Completion of planting and turfing
- Final paving, timber works, and crushed sandstone placement
- Continued sourcing of suitable stone for the north-east corner rock feature wall

These final touches will complete the upgrade and ensure the precinct is looking its best — ready for the community to enjoy over summer.

Community Impacts

Council thanks the community for their patience as works at Peregrine Beach Square near completion. These essential upgrades have addressed long-standing maintenance issues and improved the safety, accessibility, and overall amenity of the square.

Only minor finishing works remain, including paving, planting, and stage touch-ups. Temporary fencing will stay in place briefly to allow these final tasks to be completed safely.
